“Disagree” Answer

Tokyo will host the 2020 Summer Olympic Games. Although there may be some benefits, I do not think that Japan will benefit overall. I would like to look at costs, effects outside of Tokyo, and the negative impact of tourism.

First, we should look at the many Olympic Games held in the past. They usually cost much more than expected. Typically, the city and country hosting take on debt to pay for things. Japan already has too much debt.

Second, the Olympics will be centered in and around Tokyo. It is unclear how this can benefit the rest of Japan. Already there has been criticism of how Olympic projects in Tokyo have created a shortage of construction workers. This has a negative impact on the rest of the country. Construction projects in the tsunami-damaged area of northeast Japan will become more expensive and might be delayed.

Third, it seems that the Olympic Games will help to increase the number of tourists from abroad. The goal is forty million people a year. But with nearly thirty million annual visitors now, we already see problems. There are not enough hotel rooms, the transportation system is more crowded than ever, and the language barrier creates problems for people who need to interact with non-Japanese people.

I sincerely hope the Tokyo Olympics are successful. Nevertheless, I cannot see how they will benefit Japan overall.
