English as an invitation to a world of positivity

Ayumi Tanaka radiates positive energy, and it's hard to imagine her ever getting in a funk. Tanaka attributes a large part of that good vibe to her English prowess.

"I was never the type to aspire to be like everyone else, and English was my passport to being different and individualistic, and to feeling confident about who I am."

Tanaka is a teacher at CEL (Creative English Learning) English Solutions, a school geared toward qualification for Tour-Guide Interpreter, Eiken 1 and improvement of TOEIC scores and overall English proficiency. She has a reputation for taking a clear, simple approach to English learning, with a knack for comprehensive teaching at whatever level her students happen to be. From raw beginners to seasoned learners, Tanaka's students find her classes inspiring and easy to understand.

Tanaka grew up in Yokohama, the famed international port city that has been welcoming foreigners since the mid-19th century.

"Once, when I was a child I was watching an ocean liner at the harbor. A procession of foreign people got out and started walking along the pier and the scene was somehow riveting. I realized that bevond the ocean was a whole other world, one that I had never seen. And suddenly, I wanted to go out there myself."

It helped that Tanaka's grand-

mother ran a boarding house that housed some foreign students. Whenever she went over, "there were people from other countries to talk to and make friends with."

Still, Tanaka didn't study English until her first year of junior high just like everyone else in the Japanese school system at the time.

"But right away, I wanted to be really good at it," she says. "I started listening to the English conversation programs on NHK Radio every day and never missed a program. In those days, Marsha Krakower was the teacher and I became an ardent fan. I tried to say out loud sentences she spoke."

Later, Tanaka met her idol in person, when she tried out for a "port guide" job sponsored by the city of

"I love Japanese too, but English enables me to have a different perspective on the world, and to expand my horizons. And the pronunciations of the words are beautiful to listen to. Overall, I remain just as enamored with the language as my first year of studying it," she says, and adds, "My feeling is that English never betrays you.
